<u>OWNER</u> - The Rockton School District #140 District hereby gives notice that sealed bids will be received at the Rockton School District #140 for the following described project.

PROJECT - The work for the project consists as follows:

Base Bid - Pavement Maintenance at Whitman Post Elementary / Rockton Grade Schools

The Bidder agrees to perform all work including:

Pavement preparation (brushing, cleaning, etc.),

Crack filling of all exposed and evident cracks or joints,

Applying sealcoating,

Striping or markings,

Any other general conditions or sitework contained in the plans.

TIME - Sealed bids will be received until February 29, 2024, local time, at 10:00 A.M. at the Rockton School District #140 offices, 1050 E. Union Street, Rockton, IL 61072.

Late bids <u>WILL NOT</u> be considered or accepted. Mailed bids must be postmarked and received by the time listed.

Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud at 10:01 A.M. at the at the Rockton School District #140 offices, 1050 E. Union Street, Rockton, IL 61072.

<u>BIDS</u> - All bids shall be addressed to Rockton School District #140 – Mr. Glenn Terry, Superintendent, - Pavement Maintenance at Whitman Post Elementary / Rockton Grade Schools. Bids shall be sealed and shall have the name and address of the bidder and the bid for which the bid is being submitted on the outside of the envelope. All bidders shall bid in accordance with and upon the Bid Forms included in the bid documents. All bids shall be clearly marked as a formal bid submittal on the outside of the sealed bid envelope.

PRE-BID MEETING – No pre-bid meeting is scheduled. The site is located at Whitman Post Elementary / Rockton Grade Schools – 1050 E. Union Street, Rockton IL 61072. The site is open and available for inspection during normal business or daylight hours, contractors are required to check in advance with the Rockton School District office and/or at the Whitman Elementary School / Rockton Grade School office prior to visiting the site.

PROCUREMENT OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS - In order to be a 'Plan Holder' or 'Bidder' each firm or organization shall procure plans, specifications and all bid documents from Arc Design Resources. Email Matt Adas at <a href="mailto:

<u>BID REJECTION</u> - The OWNER reserves the right to reject any and all bids, waive any informalities in bidding, or to accept a bid or bids which best serves the interests of the Rockton School District #140.

<u>WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS</u> - No bid shall be withdrawn for a period of 90 days after the scheduled opening without the consent of the OWNER.

STATE OF ILLINOIS GOVERNING LAWS AND REGULATIONS

Bid Letting

The bid letting shall be subject to Illinois Statutes.

Equal Employment Opportunity

CONTRACTOR shall comply with the Equal Employment opportunity requirements in the bid documents and certify that the Contractor is not barred from contracting with a local unit of government as a result of a violation of either Section 33E-3 or 33E-4 of the Illinois Criminal Code.

The CONTRACTOR and subcontractors must comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act, the Rules and Regulations of the Illinois Department of Human Rights, and Orders of the Illinois Human Rights Commission, provisions of the Public Works Employment Discrimination Act, 775 Illinois Compiled Statutes, 10/0.01, and the requirements of the Illinois Equal Employment Opportunity clause.

Minimum Wage

The CONTRACTOR shall be required to pay not less than the minimum wage rates established by the OWNER, as stated in the Advertisement For Bids.

Copies of the applicable wage rates are on file with the OWNER and/or incorporated in the bid documents.

The CONTRACTOR shall pay prevailing wages in accordance with, "An act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the state county city or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works" (820 ILCS 130 et Seq.). The minimum hourly rate of wages, as determined by the Wage Determination Decision of the Department of Labor referred to in these standards is included in the bid packet.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

Applicability

These Instructions to Bidders shall apply to all contracts to be awarded for the work covered by these bid documents.

Contracts

The contracts to be awarded for work covered by these bid documents are described in the Invitation for Bids, Instructions to Bidders and Information to Bidders.

Examination of Bid Documents & Site

A pre-bid meeting is NOT scheduled. Before submitting a bid, each bidder must:

- (a) examine the bid documents thoroughly,
- (b) visit the site to familiarize themselves with local conditions that may in any manner affect performance of the work,
- (c) familiarize themselves with federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations affecting performance of the work,
- (d) carefully correlate their observations with the requirements of the bid documents.

In order to be a 'Plan Holder' or 'Bidder' each firm or organization shall procure the necessary Plans, Specifications and all bid documents from Arc Design Resources Inc.

The submission of a Bid will constitute an incontrovertible representation by the bidder that they have complied with every requirement of this Specification Manual.

Interpretations

All questions about the meaning or intent of the bid documents shall be submitted to the ENGINEER in writing. Replies shall be issued by addenda emailed all parties recorded by the ENGINEER as having received the bid documents. Questions received less than 3 days prior to the date for opening of bids will not be answered or presented in an addendum. Only questions answered by formal written (or email) addenda will be binding. Oral and other verbal interpretations or clarifications will be without legal effect.

Bid Form

The Bid Form is included in the Specification Manual. The Bid Form shall be completed in ink or by typewriter. The bid price for each item on the form must be in writing and in figures, and in case of conflict the former shall apply. Where unit prices are called for, each of these items must be filled in. All computations on unit price bids shall be checked by the Owner and corrections made where an error is found. The corrected figures shall be used to determine the total of that bid.

All Bid Form pages must be provided in the bid. The bidder shall acknowledge the receipt of all addenda issued in the space provided in the Bid Form. All addenda shall be returned with the bid.

Bidders, when signing the Bid Form, shall meet the following requirements:

Corporation - Executed in the corporate name and signed by the president, vice president or other authorized agent, with the corporate seal affixed and attested by the secretary or notary. The corporate address and state in which it is incorporated must be shown below the signature.

Firms or Partnerships - Executed in the partnership name and signed by a partner or authorized agent. The official title and the official address of the partnership must be shown below the signature.

Individuals - Executed and signed by the individual bidder or agent. Bids which are signed by an attorney- in-fact for individuals, firms, partnerships, or joint ventures shall be accompanied by a power-of-attorney evidencing authority to sign the bid.

All names must be typed or printed below the signature.

Time of Completion

The CONTRACTOR agrees to commence the work at the site on or after **May 28th, 2024**, and after the formal Notice to Proceed is issued from the Owner. The Bidder further agrees to complete all work covered by the Contract to the point of Final Completion on or before **July 26th, 2024**.

The contract shall be considered completed when all work called for by the bid documents has been completed and accepted by the OWNER.

Submission of Bids

Bids shall be submitted at the time and place indicated in the Invitation For Bids. Bids shall be in an opaque, sealed envelope and shall be marked with the bidder's name and address, the name of the OWNER and the project title and the bid name and number or names and numbers for which the bid is presented.

Bid Forms (in its entirety), bid security, and other documentation required by the bid documents shall accompany the bid.

Unit Prices

Unit prices may be required in the bid forms. When required, the bidder shall bid on all units called for. The OWNER reserves the right to use these unit prices should extra work be necessary, or to proceed with extra work as stated in the General Conditions.

Bid Bond

A Bid Bond in the amount of 5% of the total bid price will be required to be accompanied with each submitted bid.

Performance Bond

A Performance Bond equal to the total bid price will be required upon award of the contract to the winning bidder.

Withdrawal of Bids

Bids may be withdrawn at any time prior to the time of bid opening. Any bid withdrawn prior to the bid opening may not be resubmitted. No bid may be withdrawn after the bid opening for the period of time indicated in the Advertisement For Bids, except as permitted under Illinois State Statues.

Minimum Wage

The CONTRACTOR(S) shall be required to pay not less than the minimum wage rates established by the State of Illinois, Department of Labor and/or the U.S. Department of Labor as stated in the Advertisement For Bids.

Copies of the applicable wage rates are on file with the OWNER, Winnebago County, and/or incorporated in the bid documents.

Subcontractors

Bidders are required to list their proposed subcontractors prior to commencing the work.

The OWNER reserves the right to reject the use of any proposed subcontractor without increasing the bidprices.

The bidder shall not be required to employ any subcontractor against whom they have reasonable objections.

Substitutions

The materials, products and equipment described in the bidding documents establish a standard of required function, dimension, appearance, and quality to be met by any proposed substitution.

No substitution will be considered prior to receipt of bids unless a written request for approval has been received by the ENGINEER at least 10-days prior to the date for receipt of bids. Such requests shall include the name of the material or equipment for which it is to be substituted and a complete description of the proposed substitution including drawings, performance and test data, and other information necessary for an evaluation. A statement setting forth changes in other materials, equipment, or other portions of the work, including changes in the work of other contracts that incorporation of the proposed substitution would require shall be included. The burden of proof of the merit of the proposed substitution is upon the proposer. The ENGINEER's decision of approval or disapproval of the proposed substitution shall be final.

No substitutions will be considered after the contract award, unless specifically provided in the bid documents.

Qualifications Of Bidder

The OWNER may make such investigations as deemed necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform the work and the bidder shall furnish to the OWNER all such information and data as may be requested for this purpose. The OWNER reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of, such bidder fails to satisfy the OWNER that such bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and complete the work as described by the bid documents. Conditional bids shall not be accepted.

Before a contract is awarded, the bidder to whom an award is contemplated may be required to submit the following information:

The address of and description of the bidder's plant or permanent place of business.

An itemized list of the bidder's plant and equipment.

A financial statement of the bidder indicating financial resources to meet any obligations arising from the work.

A list of projects similar in nature which have been satisfactorily constructed by the bidder.

A listing of technical experience of personnel guaranteed to be employed in responsible charge of the work.

Such additional information as will satisfy the OWNER that the bidder is adequately prepared to fulfill the contract.

Similar information may be required from any proposed subcontractor or equipment manufacturer should the OWNER feel that such information is necessary to determine which bid will be in the best interest of theOWNER.

Right To Accept Or Reject Bids

The OWNER reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any irregularities or informalities in the bids, to disregard all non-conforming or conditional bids and to accept any bid which will best serve the interests of the OWNER, all subject to the requirements of applicable federal procurement regulations.

A bid which has not been prepared in accordance with these instructions or which does not contain an adequate and reasonable bid or unit price for each item in the Bid Form may be considered irregular and subject to rejection.

Errors in the extension of unit prices will be corrected providing the unit price is legible and found to be in compliance with the specifications. The total bid will be adjusted in accordance with the corrected extensions.

Award Of Contract

The bid opening shall be as stated in the Advertisement For Bids. No awards shall be made until the opened bids can be compared, tabulated, reviewed, and approved by the OWNER. The contract award shall be by OWNER action and the bidder to whom the award will be made will be notified by the OWNER after formal approval by the District Board anticipated to be at the March 20th, 2024 meeting.

Contract(s) shall be awarded to the lowest responsive responsible bidder. On unit price contracts, the low bidder will be determined by the total of the unit prices extended by the estimated number of units indicated in the Bid Form. On lump sum bids, the low bid shall be the apparent low base bid.

The OWNER shall compare bids on the following basis:

The lowest total of base bid items for each individual bid.

The total of individual bids for each bid versus any combination of combined bids and individual bids depending upon bids received.

The total of the base bid plus owner selected alternate bid(s).

The OWNER reserves the right to give responsible weight to:

Cost of operation, maintenance and repairs and rate of depreciation.

The probability of the contract being carried to a successful completion within the time specified, with the means, methods, and equipment the bidder proposes to use.

The extent of the bidder's experience with work of the nature involved.

The OWNER reserves the right to award the contracts to the lowest individual bidder or any combination of bidders, whichever may be to the OWNER'S best interest.

Governing Laws - State of Illinois

The bidder shall herewith take notice that all State of Illinois Statutes, municipal ordinances and regulations, and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over the construction of this project shall apply to all contracts throughout, and they shall be deemed to be included in all bids as though written out in full and if referred to, shall be interpreted to mean the most recent on record regardless of the designation used in the bid documents.

All work under these bid documents shall be in accordance with the requirements of the Rules of the Illinois Department of Labor.

The bidder shall investigate the statutory requirements for payment of sales taxes and shall include the cost of payments in the bid prices in the Bid Form.

INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS

Construction Lavout And/Or Staking

This work shall be completed by the CONTRACTOR or may be provided by Arc Design Resources Inc., or as required by the Owner for project continuity. The CONTRACTOR shall contact Bill Laskonis at (815)-484-4300 Ext. 248 for a quote. The cost of staking shall be included in the contractor's bid.

Warranty

The CONTRACTOR shall warranty all work and materials for a period of one year commencing on the date of Final Acceptance by the OWNER.

Barricades & Warning Devices

The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for the erection and maintenance of all barricades, guardrails, lights, and signs necessary for public safety and convenience. All hazards within the limits of the work or on detours around the work must be marked with visible, well-painted, well-maintained barricades, lanterns, torches, flares, reflectors, electric lights, flashers, or caution, warning and directional signs in sufficient quantity and size to adequately protect life and property. These safeguards shall be moved, changed, increased, or removed as required during the progress of the work to meet changing conditions.

The CONTRACTOR shall conduct all traffic control operations in accordance with the standard drawings included in the plans, the latest issues of the "Manual On Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD) and the "Illinois Department Of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction" latest editions.

Barricades shall be maintained in rigidly assembled condition. They shall be kept clean and the reflecting strips in good repair so as to be readily discernible at all times.

General Site Safety

The CONTRACTOR shall also comply with "Occupational Safety and Health Act" requirements issued by the Federal Government and/or adopted by the state and local laws, rules and regulations, as they apply.

Nealect

The OWNER reserves the right to remedy any neglect on the part of the CONTRACTOR as regards the protection of the work and public after 24-hours' notice in writing, except in case of emergency when it shall have the right to remedy any neglect without due notice and in either case to deduct the cost of such remedy from any money due or to become due the CONTRACTOR.

COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Installing, manufacturing, assembling and maintaining sound and intercom, protection alarm (security), fire alarm, master antenna television, closed circuit television, low voltage control for computers and/or door monitoring, school communications systems, telephones and servicing of nurse and emergency calls, and the installation and maintenance of transmit and receive antennas, transmitters, receivers, and associated apparatus which operates in conjunction with above systems. All work associated with these system installations will be included EXCEPT the installation of protective metallic conduit in new construction projects (excluding less than ten-foot, runs strictly for protection of cable) and 120 volt AC (or higher) power wiring and associated hardware.

Backhoe Bucket or over or with attachments); Compressor and Throttle Valve; Compressor, Common Receiver (3); Concrete Breaker or Hydro Hammer; Concrete Grinding Machine; Concrete Mixer or Paver 7S Series to and including 27 cu. ft.; Concrete Spreader; Concrete Curing Machine, Burlap Machine, Belting Machine and Sealing Machine; Concrete Wheel Saw (large self-propelled - excluding walk-behinds and hand-held); Conveyor Muck Cars (Haglund or Similar Type); Drills, all; Finishing Machine - Concrete; Highlift Shovels or Front Endloader; Hoist - Sewer Dragging Machine; Hydraulic Boom Trucks (All Attachments); Hydro Blaster; All Locomotives, Dinky; Off-Road Hauling Units; Non-Self Loading Dump; Ejection Dump; Pump Cretes: Squeeze Cretes - Screw Type Pumps, Gypsum Bulker and Pump; Roller, Asphalt; Rotary Snow Plows; Rototiller, Seaman, etc., self-propelled; Scoops - Tractor Drawn; Self-Propelled Compactor; Spreader - Chip - Stone, etc.; Scraper; Scraper - Prime Mover in Tandem (Regardless of Size); Tank Car Heater; Tractors, Push, Pulling Sheeps Foot, Disc, Compactor, etc.; Tug Boats.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION Class 1. Two or three Axle Trucks. A-frame Truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors

and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks andtractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry-alls; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Oil Distributors 2-man operation; Pavement Breakers; Pole Trailer, up to 40 feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-propelled Chip Spreader; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Truck Conveyor Operation, 2 or 3 man; TTeamsters Unskilled dumpman; and Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, barricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Class 2. Four axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump

Turnapulls or Turnatrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yeards; Ready-mix Plant Hopper Operator, and Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 3. Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump

Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.
