14. Superintendent's Report

- School Report Card Presentation

Mr. Phelps presented the data picture of RSD#140 to the BOE. The Board looked at Proficiency v. Grade Level and Proficiency v. Growth. Mr. Phelps explained how growth is the most meaningful school improvement metric because it recognizes progress no matter where the student started.

Mr. Phelps went into the key report card findings and the comparison to State values and previous year's values. Mr. Phelps highlighted some areas that contribute to the report card findings including chronic absenteeism, truancy, and average class size. He stated that last year WPES received exemplary status. Unfortunately, the state has changed its scoring percentages which in turn lowered our scores.

Mr. Phelps explained the differences between Summative Assessments and Formative Assessments and likened them to 'autopsy' vs. 'checkup'.

- State of the District Overview


Mr. Phelps advised the BOE that he was hoping to have the State of the District completed by the end of the week, but if not it would be released to the District by next Tuesday.
